### **Monitoring Election Results in Kansas**

TOPEKA, Kansas –Beth Clarkson, Wichita State University Statistician, will speak about “Citizen Exit Polls Used in Southeast Kansas to verify Election Outcomes” at the Topeka & Shawnee County League of Women Voters’ Oct. 3 Tuesday Topics meeting at 12 noon at the Topeka & Shawnee County Public Library.

Clarkson will update the League about her personal quest to explain anomalies in results from voting machines in Kansas and other states. Clarkson had filed an open records lawsuit in February 2015 so she could audit voting machine results. She says she wants to assure all voters their votes will count and be counted. Her legal requests for access to paper voting machine tapes from the 2014 election were denied.

The League of Women Voters of Topeka-Shawnee County is a non-partisan political organization with the goal of empowering citizens to actively participate in their government at the local, state and national levels. Both men and women are welcome to join the League to participate in its volunteer activities.

The meeting is free and open to the public. An optional lunch will be available for \$10 at 11:30 a.m.
